On September 11, 2001, almost 21 years ago, 246 people went to sleep in preparation for their morning flights. 2,606 people went to sleep in preparation for work in the morning. 343 firefighters went to sleep in preparation for their morning shift. 60 police officers went to sleep in preparation for morning patrol. 8

paramedics went to sleep in preparation for the morning shift. They all died heroes. The one thing we can all do is recognize their lives were not lost in vain. I ask you to join me in vowing to "never forget" and to continue living our lives stronger and more unified.

In memory of 9-1-1, Hunt Military Communities and Hunt Heroes Foundation is once again hosting the Patriot Essay Contest. This is open to any child between the ages of 8-18. RECIPE CORNER

Apple Crisp

Ingredients

10 cups all-purpose apples, peeled, cored and sliced	1/2 cup water
1 cup white sugar	1 cup quick-cooking oats
1 tablespoon all-purpose flour	1 cup all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon	1 cup packed brown sugar
	1/4 teaspoon baking powder
	1/4 teaspoon baking soda
	1/2 cup butter, melted

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degree C)
2. Place the sliced apples in a 9x13 inch pan. Mix the white sugar, 1 tablespoon flour and ground cinnamon together, and sprinkle over apples. Pour water evenly over all.
3. Combine the oats, 1 cup flour, brown sugar, baking powder, baking soda and melted butter together. Crumble evenly over the apple mixture.
4. Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for about 45 minutes.

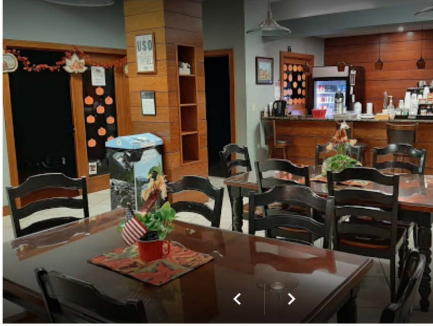
